Getting to DeSales University

From Scranton and North

Take I-476, the NE extension of the PA turnpike to Rt. 22. Proceed east 1/8 mile on Rt. 22 to Rt. 309 south (towards Quakertown). In a few miles, Rt. 309 joins with I-78. Continue south on this combined I-78 and Rt. 309 until Rt. 309 branches off toward the south (about five miles, Exit 60). Continue south on Rt. 309 another 3 miles. At the intersection of Rt. 309 and Rt. 378, make a left onto Rt. 378. Take Rt. 378 north for about 1/2 mile and turn right at Preston Lane and follow Preston to Billera Hall which will be on the right.

From New York/New Jersey

Take the NJ Turnpike and/or I-287 to I-78 west across NJ and into PA to Rt. 309 south (Exit 60A). Then follow directions from 309 south above from the north.

From Philadelphia and South

Take I-476, the NE Extension of the PA Turnpike to exit 44 (Quakertown exit). Follow Rt.663 to Quakertown, turn left onto Rt. 309 (North) proceed 8 miles to the intersection of Rt. 309 and Rt. 378. Proceed north for about 1/2 mile and turn right onto Preston Lane. Follow Preston into campus and Billera Hall which will be on the right

From Harrisburg and West

Proceed East on I-78 to (Exit 60) Rt. 309 south. Then follow directions from 309 south above from the north.

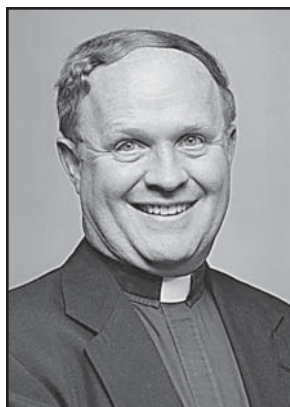

ADMINISTRATION



THE REV. BERNARD O'CONNOR, OSFS University President

Father Bernard O'Connor was appointed the third President of DeSales University in April of 1999, and started his tenure on July 1, 1999.

Fr. O'Connor was previously executive vice president of the University from 1997 to 1998. He also served as associate vice president for academic affairs from 1993 to 1994 and academic dean from 1994 to 1997.

In 1974, Fr. O'Connor joined the faculty of DeSales University, formerly Allentown College of St. Francis de Sales, as an instructor in philosophy. He served as assistant professor of philosophy and

chair of the philosophy department from 1980 through 1987, at which time he was named associate professor and chair of the philosophy and theology departments. In 1990, he received the Sears Roebuck Foundation Teaching Excellence and Campus Leadership Award.

Prior to joining the faculty of DeSales University, he earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in philosophy at The Catholic University in 1969 and 1971, respectively. He earned a second master's degree in theology from the DeSales Hall School of Theology in 1974, and in 1986, he completed his doctorate in philosophy from The Catholic University.

In 1982, he was elected to the 15th General Chapter of the Oblates of St. Francis de Sales, Paderborn, Germany. He is the author of "A Dialogue Between Philosophy and Religion: The Perspective of Karl Jaspers." Fr. O'Connor is a member of the American Philosophical Association, the American Catholic Philosophical Association, the Fellowship of Catholic Scholars, and has served on the board of directors for Lehigh Valley Industrial Park since 2001.



SCOTT COVAL Director of Athletics

Scott Coval enters his ninth year as DeSales University Director of Athletics. Coval is responsible for the planning, organization, management and evaluation of DeSales 16-sport men's and women's NCAA Division III intercollegiate athletics program.

Coval has been with the University for the last 15 years as the head men's basketball coach. Since joining the DSU staff, Coval has also served as the school's coordinator of athletic recruiting, head men's golf coach, and as the assistant athletic director.

Since taking over the men's basketball program at DeSales, Coval has compiled a 256-144 (.640)

record and has led the team to the post-season 12 of the last 13 years including the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament berth in 1995-96.

Prior to arriving in Center Valley, Coval was an assistant coach at Lafayette College for five years. He has also been an assistant at Penn State University and the College of William & Mary. A standout player at Whitehall High School, Coval continued his playing career at William & Mary, where he was named team captain and MVP his senior year. He graduated from William & Mary in 1986 with a degree in Business Management.

A member of the Lehigh Valley Basketball Hall of Fame, Coval is the director of the DeSales University basketball camp and helps with many other camps throughout the Eastern Pennsylvania and Western New Jersey areas.

Coval resides in Orefield, PA, with his wife Kaye and their two daughters, Keeley and Mia and son, Nicholas.

HEAD COACH FRED RICHTER



Fred Richter

Head Coach

East Stroudsburg University ('71)

Head coach Fred Richter enters his 19th season in Center Valley as one of the most successful coaches in the entire country. He opens the season with a career record of 347-149 (.700) and is one of just two coaches in DeSales history (all sports) to garner 300+ wins. Richter enters the season ranked 32nd among all active NCAA Division III coaches in career victories and 40th among all active coaches in winning percentage.

Throughout his 18 years, the 2007-08 season was perhaps his brightest as he led the Bulldogs to their third Freedom Conference championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament "Sweet 16" where they fell to eventual undefeated national champion, Howard Payne University, in Brownwood, TX and finished with a 26-4 overall record.

Overall Richter has led DeSales to 10 20-win seasons and to the post-season in 17 of his 18 years. The Bulldogs joined the Freedom Conference in 1997-98 and have since run off 11-straight post-season appearances, won three conference championships, and have advanced to the Freedom Conference championship game seven times.

Richter has also enjoyed both regional and national success during his tenure. In addition to five conference championships he has won including two Pennsylvania Athletic Conference titles (1996, 1997) and the three MAC/Freedom titles (1998, 2000, 2008), DSU has made six trips to the NCAA Tournament (1996, 1997, 1998, 2000, 2003, 2008) and won four ECAC South Region Tournament Championships (1999, 2002, 2004 and 2005). Richter has been named Coach of the Year four times including twice in the Freedom Conference (2004 and 2008), once as the WBCA Mid-Atlantic Regional Coach of the Year (2003-04) and once by the Eastern States Athletic Conf. (ESAC) Coach of the Year in 1992-93.

Prior to taking over at DeSales in 1990, Richter was a highly successful girls' varsity coach at Quakertown High School. He finished with a record of 145-80 in nine seasons and his teams qualified for the district playoffs each season. The Panthers captured one league championship and reached the state championship tournament twice during Richter's tenure. He also coached the boys' teams at Quakertown and at Central Bucks East High School in Buckingham, PA.

Richter was also an outstanding scholastic and collegiate player. He was twice an all-league pick and Most Valuable Player at Quakertown before moving on to East Stroudsburg University.



While at ESU, he was a two-time selection for team captain, named MVP following his junior season, and named to the All-Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Team after his senior campaign. Richter has been inducted into

both the Quakertown/Pennridge Area Sports Hall of Fame and East Stroudsburg University Athletics Hall of Fame.

Coach Richter is four years removed from being a full-time high school social studies teacher at Quakertown Senior High School for 34 years. He coached the Bulldogs as a part-time coach for the first 15-years and will be entering his fourth season as a full-time staff member. He resides in Coopersburg, Pa., with his wife, Vicky.

Megan Dellegrotti joins Coach Richter's staff for her third season as an assistant coach with the Bulldogs.

Dellegrotti, a native of Berwick, PA, has a wealth of basketball experience as both a player and a coach. Her coaching experience extends to both the high school and collegiate level over the last four years. She spent one year as a student assistant with the Blue Hens while

working towards her Bachelor's degree in Health and Physical Education in 2003. Following her graduation from Delaware she moved onto the high school level at nearby Southern Lehigh High School where she worked as an assistant coach for the girls' varsity team for three years.

As a player, Dellegrotti's resume is endless. She was a standout player at Berwick High School where she was named All-State twice, named Wyoming Valley Conference Player of the Year three times, scored 2,311 points and holds the single-game scoring record of 62 points. In addition, she led Berwick to three Wyoming Valley Conference Championships and to two District II Championships.

Dellegrotti furthered her playing career at the University of Delaware where she was a four-year member of the Blue Hen basketball program. Following her last season of eligibility she ranked 13th in scoring (1,112 points) and as the all-time leader in three-pointers made with 154. She also holds the record for most three-pointers made in one game (6) and most treys made in one season with 54.

She was named team captain as both a junior and senior, named to the America East All-Rookie Team, named to the All-Colonial League Second-Team once and was named the University of Delaware Most Outstanding Female Athlete as a senior.

Dellegrotti resides in Bethlehem, Pa. and is a full-time Health and Physical Education teacher at Southern Lehigh High School.

Sheri Melady
Assistant Coach

The University of Scranton ('92)



Sheri Melady returns to Coach Richter's bench for her 13th season with the Bulldogs after serving as Richter's primary assistant from 1992-02 and returning on a full-time basis last year.

Melady, a native of Quakertown, was a standout player at Quakertown High School under coach Richter. She was an all-league player in 1987 and 1988 before graduating in 1988 and continuing her playing career at The University of Scranton.

While at Scranton, Melady was a member of a Royals team that reached the NCAA Division III Elite Eight in 1990. She was named Scranton's Most Improved Player following the 1990-91 season and soon graduated from Scranton in 1992 with a bachelor's degree in physical therapy.

She immediately joined Richter's staff for the 1992-93 season and spent 10 years with Richter before returning this season after taking a few years off. Melady's main responsibilities are coaching the post players and developing their talent to fit the Division III level. In her previous 10 years she helped develop three 1,000 point scorers and was responsible for the chief development of DeSales' long list of talented post players in the late 90's.

Melady lives in Schnecksville with her husband Jerry and son Jacob. She works full-time as a physical therapist at Lehigh Valley Hospital.

2008-09 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL PREVIEW

I don't think many will argue when I say the 2007-08 DeSales University women's basketball team had perhaps the greatest season in women's basketball history last year. Sure, they were one win shy of a school-record win total held by the 1989-90 squad and both those teams won conference titles and advanced to the NCAA Tournament, but the '07-08 Bulldogs won one more game in the "big dance" and went all the way to the "Sweet 16" before being bounced by the eventual national champion, Howard Payne University, who finished the season without ever tasting defeat. At the very least those two seasons stand side by side in the history books.

2007-08 was by all measure a "dream" season. It was a year never to be forgotten by all of those involved and likely very difficult to duplicate. Don't tell that to the '08-09 Bulldogs though, because those still part of DSU's roster from last year are very much dreaming about doing it all over again.

Last year's celebration is over and the focus is very much on new goals, new challenges, and new dreams. Last year DSU spent much of the year trying to prove it could still compete on a national level after not smelling the sweet aroma of an NCAA Tournament since the 2002-03 season prior to last year. Prove it they did and they have been rewarded during the pre-season as D3hoops.com has ranked DeSales #9 in their national pre-season poll. Now the team faces the challenge of staying on top. They will take every team's best shot as those playing the Bulldogs will want to be the team that can wake up the next morning after a date with DeSales saying "We beat the defending Freedom Conference champions and an NCAA "Sweet 16" qualifier."

So the Bulldogs began practice on October 15th, they are not working hard to earn their status as a national team to reckon with but rather to maintain their status as a team that belongs in the conversations regarding the top 10 teams in the country.

What are the goals? Well head coach **Fred Richter** has always been known to stress defense 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and 365 days a year. The old cliché is "Defense wins championships". It seemed to ring true last year as the Bulldogs ranked first in points allowed in the Freedom Conference surrendering just 54.1 points per game on their way to a Freedom Conference title. That is goal #1, excel on defense and defend the conference championship.

A Freedom Conference championship comes with an automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament and I think if you asked the players on this year's team goal #2 would be to advance further than last year. We all know what that means. All of a sudden the words "Elite 8" and "Final Four" enter the conversation.

Both of these goals are lofty and I am a firm believer that you have to be both a good team and a little lucky during the course of a season

to achieve the success achieved last year. The Bulldogs have some big shoes to fill with the graduation of three important seniors (**Amanda Kuperavage**, **Jenna Stampf**, and **Rose Katz**) and will also need to stay healthy as they did last year using the same starting lineup for all 30 games.

Leading the attack once again will be one of the best backcourt combinations in the entire country in seniors **Kim Rarick** (Ringtown, PA/North Schuylkill) and **LeighAnn Burke** (Philadelphia, PA/Archbishop Ryan). Both Rarick and Burke achieved success on the national stage last season and will undoubtedly be the leaders of this team, especially on the offensive end of the court.

Burke had a season to remember last year leading the team in scoring at 19.3 points per game and setting a school-record with 74 made three-pointers. She was named the Freedom Conference Player of the Year and a D3hoops.com Second-Team All-American, while also earning ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District First-Team honors and being named a Jostens Trophy Finalist. Burke has already been recognized this season being named a D3hoops.com Pre-Season First-Team All-American.

Rarick also had a spectacular junior season ranking second on the team in scoring at 15.1 points per game and leading the Bulldogs with 125 assists. She achieved national success by leading the entire country in free throw shooting, canning 93.0 percent (146-of-157) of her freebies. Rarick was also honored on the All-Freedom Conference First-Team.

The other two returning starters are juniors **Kaila Wiand** (Royersford, PA/Spring-Ford) and **Caitlin Miller** (Fogelsville, PA/Northwestern Lehigh). Miller earned All-Freedom Conference Second-Team honors last season averaging 8.4 points per game and leading the team in rebounding, pulling down 9.6 boards per game. Wiand averaged 5.3 points per game and led the team with 25 blocked shots at the small forward position.

The fifth starting spot is up for grabs entering the season and will likely be filled by several different players throughout the season. Among the returning players expected

to fill an important role off the bench are senior **Erica Sovak** (Tuxedo, NY/George F. Baker), juniors **Emily Hoffman** (Laceyville, PA/Wyalusing Valley) and **Kelly Magrann** (Sinking Spring, PA/Holy Name), and sophomores **Megan Montchyk** (Bellmawr, NJ/Paul VI) and **Shaina**

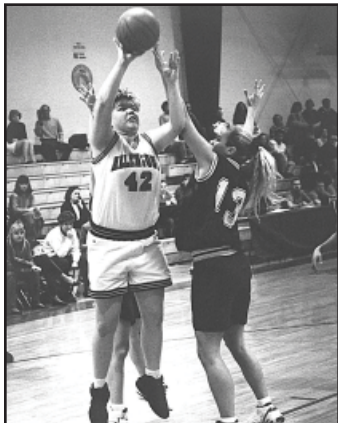

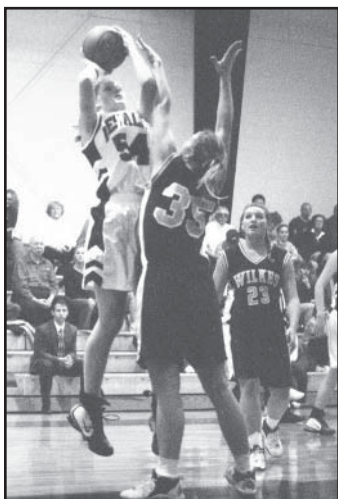

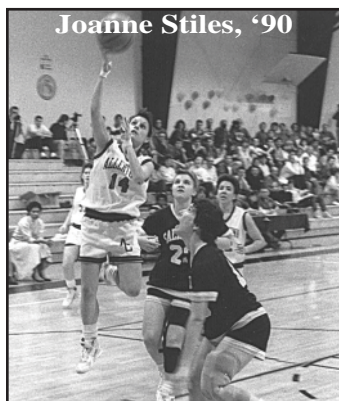
